The World Economic Forum (WEF) lists Pfizer as a partner, but Pfizer doesn't disclose this spending to its shareholders. WEF openly advocates for transhumanism, and indicates how medical devices – which Pfizer and its partners produce – are instrumental to "redefining what it means to be human." At one WEF conference, Mr. Bourla – who is a WEF "agenda contributor" – discussed the development of an "electronic pill" that can send signals from the patient's stomach. Mr. Bourla said of this technology: "[i]magine the implications of that – the compliance."

Why is Pfizer willing to financially support WEF and contribute to its transhumanist agenda, but unwilling to be forthright about it to shareholders?
